	SB 912	Eliminates the 5 percent Medi-Cal provider payment reductions that took effect 1/1/06. Urgency clause to take effect immediately.	2
<i>Thursday, April 06, 2006</i>			
	SB 699	Enacts HIV reporting statutes. On February 27 was amended with minor technical edits.	20
<i>Thursday, August 10, 2006</i>			
	SB 1852	Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes in various provisions of law to effectuate the recommendations made by the Legislative Counsel to the Legislature regarding maintenance of the Codes. H&S Codes regarding HIV/AIDS are: 120830, 120875, 121110, 121270, and 121275.	538

	AB 1147	Revises the definition of marijuana so that the term would instead not include industrial hemp, except where the plant is cultivated or processed for purposes not expressly allowed.	VETOED
	AB 1859	Extends by five years the dates upon which the provisions relating to the Placer County health and human services pilot project would become inoperative and would be repealed.	268

	SJR 22	Memorialize the United States Congress and President to enact the Microbicide Development Act (S.550 and HR 3854) to facilitate the development of microbicides to prevent the transmission of HIV and other diseases.	127
<i>Monday, August 28, 2006</i>			
	SB 1422	Regulates public safety and makes technical nonsubstantive changes to provisions related to, among other things crime, firearms, child welfare, and controlled substance addition.	901
	SB 1500	Requires the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs to develop and conduct a statewide campaign designed to deter the abuse of methamphetamine. Authorizes the department to accept voluntary contributions and requires that the department deposit the contributions into the Methamphetamine Abuse Prevention Fund, created by the bill.	662
<i>Wednesday, August 30, 2006</i>			
	AB 2870	Amends existing law which provides for the confidential testing of inmates and other enumerated persons for HIV and AIDS under specified circumstances. Allows testing for other infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases as well as HIV and AIDS. Adds prosecutors and public defender staff to the list of persons who may request testing, and includes court facilities in the location where the contact with bodily fluids may be made. 8/7/06 amendments makes technical edits to correct state agency names and adds prosecutory staff persons to the list of persons who can file a report.	800

	SB 1341	Relates to the tax exemption for retail items sold by thrift stores operated by a nonprofit organization, if the purpose of that store is to obtain funding for medical and social services provided to persons who is chronically ill. Extends the repeal date of that exemption to 1/1/2012.	373
<i>Thursday, August 31, 2006</i>			
	AB 1677	Permits any nonprofit or health care agency to distribute sexual barrier protection devices, such as condoms or dental dams in state prisons. Possession of barrier devices shall not be used as evidence of illegal activity.	VETOED
<i>Wednesday, September 06, 2006</i>			
	SB 1471	Requires any program that provides education to prevent adolescent or unintended pregnancy or to prevent STIs and is conducted or administered by the state, or receives any financial assistance from state funds to meet specified requirements. 8/7/06 amendments enacts the California Community Sexual Health Education Act, and makes minor technical edits.	VETOED
<i>Thursday, September 07, 2006</i>			
	AB 2280	Formerly the HIV Counseling and Testing Model. This bill was amended on 6/15/06 to add provisions for medical practitioners to provide patient-delivered treatment to sexual partners of patients diagnosed with gonorrhea or other sexually transmitted diseases.	771
	SB 162	Establishes the State Department of Public Health and renames CDHS to the State Department of Health Care Services. 8/7/06 amendments enacts the Public Health Advisory Committee, deletes references to several CDHS divisions, and amends and renumbers several H&S Code Sections.	241
<i>Monday, September 11, 2006</i>			
	AB 2404	Requires any written reports required to be submitted by any state agency, board, or commission and specified reports required to be submitted to the Controller by any city, county, city and county, or transit district, to include a signed statement by the head of the agency, the chair of the board or commission, or the officer of the local agency, except as specified, declaring, that the contents of the report are true, accurate, and complete to the best of his or her knowledge. 8/7/06 amendments enacts civil penalties not to exceed \$20,000 to any person who declares as true any material matter... that he or she knows to be false.	VETOED
