Krekorian	Would require health care service plans and health insurers, on or after Jan 1, 2009, to offer testing for HIV/AIDS regardless of whether the testing is related to a primary diagnosis. Contains other related provisions.		02-07-Introduced
ASSEMBLY BILLS TO WATCH			
AB 1646			
DeSaulnier	Would authorize counties to impose a transactions and use tax for specified public health purposes (disease surveillance, investigation, prevention, registry, and disaster/emergency preparedness) if certain conditions are met.		01-17-Amended
AB 1984			
Swanson	Requires the Department, in coordination with the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, to make tests for HIV available at each state prison or at another location for each inmate of a state prison on a voluntary basis, immediately upon the inmate's release from the prison.		02-14-Introduced
SENATE BILLS			
SB 1184			
Kuehl	Would require each clinical lab to report all CD4 count test results, as defined, to the local health officer within 7 days of the completion of the CD4 count test. If a CD4 count test result is related to a case of HIV infection, the local health officer would be required to report the case of HIV infection or AIDS to the department within 45 days of receipt of the report. By increasing the duties of local officials, this bill would create a state-mandated local program.		02-12- Introduced
